STUDENT DECLARATION

Personal Safety

When I use digital technologies and the internet I will:

- protect and not share my personal information (my full name, photo, birthday, address and phone number).
- protect my passwords and not share them with anyone except my parents or teacher.
- actively participate in cyber safety and 'eSmart' lessons in my classroom.

Communicate Respectfully

When I use digital technologies and the internet, I will communicate respectfully by:

- always thinking and checking that what I write, post, share or say is polite and respectful.
- working to stop bullying I don't send or share mean or bullying messages or pass them on to others.

Demonstrate Responsibility

When I use digital technologies and the internet I will show responsibility by:

- only using sites and apps that are appropriate for my age if I am not sure I ask a trusted adult for help.
- speaking to a trusted adult if I see something that makes me feel upset or uncomfortable.
- not deliberately searching for anything that is inappropriate, rude or violent.
- being careful with the equipment I use.
- only using devices for my school work and not using devices at play times (recess/ lunch).

BREAKING THE STUDENT AGREEMENT

If I break the Student ICT Use Agreement, a number of steps can be taken, including:

- having my 'Murrumbeena Primary Digital Licence' card punched as a result of my warning. (I have 3 warnings)
- having my ICT rights withdrawn for a period of time as deemed appropriate (when a warning is used).
- the teaching staff will notify my parents/ guardians.
- reflecting on my actions with my teacher, and or a member of the Learning Technologies or School Leadership Teams, to prioritise the safe use of ICT.
- undertaking restorative actions or consequences, as outlined in the school's Bullying Prevention and Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policies (refer to school website).

DEFINITION OF ICT

Information and Communications Technology (ICT) is the hardware and software that enables data to be digitally processed, stored and communicated. ICT can be used to access, process, manage and present information; model and control events; construct new understanding; and communicate with others. ICT includes, but is not limited to:

- Computer systems and applications such as email, and the internet
- Networks
- Electronic storage devices
- Mobile devices such as mobile phones, tablet devices (such as iPads)
- Smartwatches such as Garmin, Fitbit, VTech, Space Talk and others
- Google Chromebooks
- Web-based tools such as social networking sites, chat rooms, blogs, podcasts, instant messaging systems, and P2P file sharing
- Imaging tools such as video, still or web cameras and related software
- Audio tools such as audio recording devices, mp3 players and related software.

PURPOSE OF STUDENT ICT USE AGREEMENT

The purpose of this Student ICT Use Agreement is to ensure rules for appropriate use of devices and resources are followed so our students are provided with and engage in, a safe, inclusive and supportive digital learning environment. Responsible behaviour includes safely accessing, processing, managing and presenting information in the digital world.

PARENT ICT USE AGREEMENT

I give permission for my son/ daughter to use the internet and ICT facilities at the school and I:

- have read and discussed with my child the school's Student ICT Use Agreement.
- agree to my child using Information and Communication Technologies for educational purposes.
- agree to my child transmitting work electronically to teachers and having the work published where the school considers appropriate.
- agree that, whilst all normal care will be taken, the school is in no way responsible for replacement of the
 device due to theft, repairs due to breakage or any other sort of maintenance of the device (when owned
 by the student)
- understand it is my responsibility to pay for any breakage or damage to my child's device (if my child has their own device).
- understand and agree to the consequences outlined for my child breaking any ICT Use Agreements.
- acknowledge that my child's use of the device at school will at all times be subject to the directions of the

teachers and failure to follow these directions may lead to the consequences outlined in this document.

- understand that the teacher will regularly check my child's search history at any time and actively monitor their device usage.
